MINUTES

With respect to the April 2, 2012 minutes, Mary corrected a reference to a “good and sufficient fence. And the 990T IRS form.” With respect to the May 7, 2012 minutes, Mary corrected a reference to “inquiring about the plot owned by his mother and father in hopes that his parents and younger brother will be buried there. On motion by Patty, voted unanimously to accept the minutes from both meetings as corrected.

CONDITION OF CEMETERIES Linda reported that the Village Cemetery looked good, but needed another mowing. The mowing scheduled was distributed. Another mowing was scheduled for that week. Mary noted that when the cemetery was mowed by Hillside the following week many parts of the Cemetery needed mowing again because the grass was so long. In the future they would appreciate a call so they could mow again before it reached that stage of growth.

The azalea bed and hosta bed were mulched. Mary noted that the town had mowed the perpetual care section in preparation of the Despres service scheduled before the first season's mowing. In addition, Tony laid top soil and grass seed on the Willis plot as Penny Despres was concerned that Moose's grave would not be taken care of in the correct manner. Initially the Willis boys had intended to do that work, but had not as yet.

No spring clean-up has been scheduled for the West Yard Cemetery. No report on the Early Settler's Cemetery.

MONUMENT RESTORATION

Mary reported that John Clegg will be in Marlow next week. He has requested a deposit before he starts his work.
